GRANTS IN 2014

- A Pennsylvania Public Library Broadband Connectivity Micro Grant from the Pennsylvania State Library to improve Wi-Fi service in the library. Patrons have access to high-speed internet from any location within the library. User sessions can now be measured for statistical purposes.
- A Washington Financial Foundation Grant to assist with the purchase and installation of a new circulation desk on the first floor.
- A grant from the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History for programs focusing on American history topics

The Peters Township Public Library marked 15 years in our present facility on April 17, 2014. What an opportune time to reflect on where we have come from and to make plans for where we are going!

At the end of 1998, there was great anticipation about the move to the new library facility. At that time, the library had holdings of 81,309 items and two public access computer workstations. There was no online catalog, and digital resources were limited to simple internet searches and CD-ROMs.

Today we offer our patrons a variety of resources from our collection of over 126,000 items, not including eResources! Check the catalog via our **mobile web site** and you will find an enormous selection of print and audio materials, **e Readers**, **robots**, **digital magazines**, **college courses on DVD**, and **video games** – items we could only have dreamed of 15 years ago!

Though much has changed since 1999, our commitment...to enrich and empower every patron...remains constant. The tools at hand are not only what patrons find on our shelves or on our web site. Our library staff strives to provide excellent programs for every age group, many of which are highlighted in this report. With the support of our patrons, we plan for the library to remain a welcoming destination for the entire community.

In support of an informed citizenry, Peters Township Public Library provides printed and recorded materials, programs, equipment and staff services to meet the community's educational, professional, and recreational needs. The library strives to enrich and empower every patron by fostering a love of learning.

In mid-July, library began offering its patrons an exciting way to learn the art of computer programming with a new **Finch Robot** available for checkout. The Finch is a small robot designed for computer science education for students as young as 8 years old. It was created after four years of study at Carnegie Mellon's CREATE lab. The library is the first location in Pennsylvania to launch a program lending the Finch.





Replacing Zinio, the library now offers **Flipster**, providing patrons easy access to the most popular magazines through the library web site. Browse current or back issues on your computer, table, phone, or other mobile device with an internet connection. Titles available include *Time*, *Consumer Reports*, *People*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Money*, and much more.







The library continues to make progress on its **Maker Space**, an area where creativity is encouraged and patrons are supported in their efforts to seek out do-it-yourself solutions to everyday problems. Located on the second floor, the space offers, three 3-D printers, a sewing machine, an embroidery machine, a 3-D pen, a Scan-N-Cut Cutting Machine, and a heat-free laminator for patrons to use and become inspired.

Several renovation projects will be taking place including:

- Installation of new flooring in the lobby, Multi-Purpose Room, and stairwell
- Installation of a new circulation desk
- Renovation of the existing Technical Services Department into a new public reading area and café
- Renovation and modernization of the existing computer lab

In cooperation with the Peters Township Community Television, a virtual tour of the library will be created and aired on the Peters Township cable channel and posted at the library's website and social media.

A partnership with the Creative Learning Collaborative will continue with this parentled group dedicated to providing information about educational extracurricular programs for the benefit of parents and students in Peters Township and surrounding areas.

The rapid pace of change brought about by technology poses great challenges and opportunities in improving library services. Ongoing research by the Library Board Technology Committee will help to define how the library needs to develop existing technology and adapt new technology to meet the needs of the community.
