Dairy Bar program

The “Stories from the Archives” series continued with a program in September about the history of The Dairy Bar. Our program presenters, Margaret and Carrie, along with some guest speakers, discussed the property’s origins as a blacksmith shop in the early 1900’s through the realignment of the Valleybrook/McMurray intersection. Owned and operated by the Duckworth family for 64 years, their store was a beloved institution in the township. They shared precious memories from people who worked and shopped there, along with photographs documenting the many changes that occurred through the years. More than 125 people attended the live Zoom program, many tuning in from outside Pennsylvania! Another 453 have watched the YouTube recording of this program so far, in the week since it’s been posted. We love to see so many people enjoy learning about Peters Township history.
